# **KYOVA Freight Planning Activities and Initiatives\***



### **Freight Planning**

The Huntington, WV-KY-OH Transportation Management Area (TMA) considers freight mobility and intermodal transportation key parts of the overall planning process as it is important to the economic vitality of the region. In addition, the importance of freight mobility has been recognized by the United States Congress, which included increased emphasis on freight planning within the last five (5) transportation bills.

## **KYOVA Freight Plan**

Over the last decade, the incorporation of freight issues into the policy, planning and programming activities of state department of transportation (DOTs) and metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) has received significant focus from federal transportation agencies, business and industry leaders and the U. S. Congress. In 2022 KYOVA completed the Boyd/Greenup Freight Plan and is scheduled to have a regional plan by FY 2027. The following activities may be integrated into the Huntington, WV-KY-OH TMA Freight Analysis.

- Data Collection
- Identifying freight needs and deficiencies
- Developing regional freight profile
- Identification of freight projects
- Developing freight project evaluation criteria
- Identifying innovative funding and financing techniques
- Developing freight performance measures
- Outreach and public input
- Establishment of Freight Committee

#### Freight Mobility and Economic Productivity

Airports, ports, and other freight activity centers as well as the railroad network have been a cornerstone of local and regional economic prosperity. Growth of these economic generators will largely depend on the region's ability to improve and maintain efficient transportation connections within the region as well as links to other regional and statewide corridors. Improving access to the freight activity centers is an important factor in attracting new industry and associated jobs that will help stimulate the local economy.
