AGENDA ITEM #2: Approval of Minutes from Previous Meeting (December 8, 2023)

AGENDA ITEM #3: Executive Director's Report – Chris Chiles, KYOVA

- Jason Stephens, Ohio Speaker of the House
 - Speaker Stephens spoke of various on-going projects in Ohio as well as his previous tenure as Chairman of KYOVA.
- Robert Hall, Judge Executive, Greenup County, Kentucky

- Judge Hall thanked KYOVA employees for their work and dedication in all three states. He delivered a message of gratitude from the Greenup County High School Superintendent, Tracy, for their work on a critical Greenup County High School project.
- Hal Greer Boulevard Corridor Project Update
 - o Mr. Chiles informed members that progress is on-going, with construction hopefully complete in the Fall of 2024.
- Downtown Ashland Complete Street Project Update
 - Mr. Chiles explained to members that the Project continues moving forward, and construction has begun. He stated two roundabouts were open, with three under construction. This is scheduled to be complete by the end of this calendar year.
- Chesapeake Bypass Project Update
 - o Mr. Chiles stated progress continues with construction expected to start in the Spring of 2025.
- Huntington Welcome Center I-64, Exit 8
 - o Mr. Chiles gave members a brief overview of the future I-64 Welcome Center. He explained the accessibility of the location being ideal for both west and east bound traffic. He spoke of the additional tourism that this would bring to the area. He stated design, engineering and environmental are in process now to get the project shovel ready.
- TMA Certification Review Update
 - o Mr. Chiles explained that per the Census numbers, KYOVA will retain its designated Transportation Management Area (TMA) status with over 200,000 residents. This means KYOVA will continue to receive additional federal dollars, including the suballocated grant funds.
- 2024 WVDOT/WVAMPO/WVLTAP Planning Conference in Huntington
 - Mr. Chiles made members aware that the WVDOT/WVAMPO/WVLTAP Planning Conference is to be in May of 2024 in Huntington, WV. He stated this would bring MPOs and DOH employees together from across the state into Huntington.
- Update on KYOVA Transportation Studies
 - Mr. Chiles briefly mentioned the various transportation studies KYOVA staff are currently involved with and directed members to KYOVA's YouTube channel for more information.

- Transit Systems Update
 - o Mr. Davis, General Manager of the Tri-State Transit Authority, gave a Transit update for the Huntington area. He discussed KYOVA's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting held on Tuesday, February 28, 2024. He described various presentations they discussed. He discussed the increase in ridership, need for newer vehicles, and the Transportation Improvement Plan that members would be voting on.

- Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) Thomas Witt
 - o Mr. Witt discussed the SHIFT 6-Year Highway Plan, the Carbon Reduction Strategy Plan, and upcoming Boyd and Greenup County Projects.
- Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) Michael Dombrowski
 - Mr. Dombrowski introduced Project Manager Tom Barnitz. Mr. Barnitz gave a brief overview of the Chesapeake Bypass Project. He stated construction was scheduled to be awarded in December 2024 and actual construction to begin in the Spring of 2025.
 Mr. Dombrowski gave members a brief overview of additional upcoming projects in Ohio.
